CUSHMAN DEPOT TO REMAIN OPEN

Denied Friday by Jonel C. Hill, public utilities commissioner was the application by Southern Pacific Co., Pacific Motor Co., and the Railway Express Agency, Inc., to withdraw the Cushman agency. The commissioner noted that withdrawal of the Cushman agent would cause great inconvenience to the community serviced and be detrimental to the welfare of the area. It was pointed out that the station was not operated at a loss although revenues had dropped. Substitute service proposed was termed "woefully inadequate".

A hearing was conducted in Florence in December.

START APPRAISALS

George P. Blinkhorn, Eugene realtor, began appraisals of properties within the urban renewal project area this week preparatory to determining preliminary estimates of cost of withdrawal areas.

It is announced by Lee Anderson, local supervisor, that twice monthly, the citizens advisory group will issue a news release letter to Florence residents keeping them informed of the project's progress.

George Vedding, who is assistant to the director, of the Lane county Housing Authority and Urban Renewal agency, visited the local Urban Renewal office Wednesday to discuss preliminary plans with local builders, who may be interested in bidding on the 30 unit project in the near future.

His visit also covered the inspection of certain aspects in the project area, including street patterns, widths and curb cuts.

Favor 2-Channel TV Reception

Two television translators will be installed here as soon as approximately \$4500 more is raised to add to the \$9700 in the fund June 9. This is the decision of subscribers in West Lane Translator Corp. by show of hands at Tuesday evening's meeting at Siuslaw junior high school.

The meeting had been called to demonstrate television reception over a single channel, a translator having been temporarily installed on Canary hill. A clear, steady picture showed on the screen, with necessary antenna and converter being in view on the auditorium stage with the set.

Paul Kafoury, television man from Newport, explained technical features of the proposed system and answered a number of questions from the audience. Get the best equipment and installation service, he advised, pointing out situations in which poor reception might result. Some locations may cause technical difficulties; only a fair trial can determine whether these cannot be overcome, he said. A few places in the area appear unsuitable for good reception. The translators will provide signals for color TV.

Up to meeting time \$9300 was raised, with new subscribers during the evening boosting the total to near \$9700.

Art Wharffield explained the work of the committee who have been directing the campaign to bring topnotch television reception to the coastal region of western Lane county.

Several persons volunteered to assist in the fund raising campaign which has as its immediate goal a sum to reach \$14,196 necessary for two channels.

Bob Wick gave data on financing the project. For one channel reception \$8675 is estimated necessary, two channel \$14,196, and three channel \$19,717. Each translator costs \$3100 (each channel requires one); building to house the equipment, \$750; a road, \$1000 and maintenance \$1500.

Close to 300 persons attended.
